The GEO (Group on Earth Observations), a voluntary partnership of governments and international organizations, was to coordinate efforts to build a Global Earth Observation System of Systems, or GEOSS. This one and a half-day workshop is focused on the role of data management and stewardship for Polar Climate Science within the context of the GEOSS. Particularly, the lessons learned and progress made as a result of the intensive work during the International Polar Year is assessed with a view to establishing a framework that allow such global collaboration to be part of routine scientific data management in the future by utilizing the architecture and philosophy of GEOSS. It is one of an ongoing series of IEEE-sponsored regional meetings across the globe in support of GEOSS.
